FACT SHEET

FRANKLIN STREET REDEVELOPMENT STUDY: PHASE 2 DECEMBER 2013

- VISION: Franklin Street will remain a critical transportation facility for all modes of travel, linking I-295 and Back Cove to the waterfront and island ferries and serving as an attractive gateway to the city. Franklin Street will be a vibrant, active and walkable urban corridor, connecting neighborhoods and destinations. It will enhance the urban fabric of the city through mixed-use development of appropriate, functional and diverse residential, commercial and recreational space in the midst of attractive streetscapes. All modes of travel, including motor vehicle, public transit, bicycle and pedestrian, shall be able to coexist in a design that is safe and environmentally sound for an urban setting through state-of-the-art design utilizing optimum architecture, street widths, curbs, sidewalks and street level crosswalks, and other appropriate amenities such as vegetation, trees and art.
- Phase 1 was a visioning process with broad public participation
- Phase 2 will assess feasibility of concepts by
 - o using data to evaluate Phase 1 components
 - o continuing to follow a Complete Streets model
 - o **engaging the public** to inform decision-making process.
- Phase 2 will arrive at a <u>single final preferred design alternative</u> that will meet future multiple needs and support vibrant growth
- The data used to evaluate the range of alternatives will include:
 - o Accessibility: connectivity, transit, bike/ped
 - Urbanism and Land Use: mixed-use, aesthetics, ease of use, wayfinding
 - Environment and Energy: reduce energy, enhance greenspace, anticipate storm surge
 - Health and Safety: promote physical activity, enhance safety, reduce vehicle speeds

 Community and Economic Development: connect to ferries, preserve neighborhoods, improve access to jobs and centers of activity

• Study Schedule is as follows:

- o June 2013: Kick Off
- o Early Fall 2013: Create Baseline Conditions Report
- o Late Fall 2013: Create Future Conditions Report
- o January 29, 2014: First Public Meeting/Refining Alternatives
- Winter/Spring 2014: Development of Final Alternatives and Analysis of Alternatives
- Summer 2014: Second Public Meeting/Arrive at Preferred Design
